

Suggestions for Success

District 742 schools work with students and families to support student success in reading and math. Some key connections with families include:

- District and school website resources to support and challenge student learning. Access is available at www.isd742.org.
- Minnesota Reading Corps provides one-on-one support for kindergarten through third grade students.
- ADSIS (Alternative Delivery of Specialized Instructional Services) provides additional small group support in reading and math.
- Lexia Core 5 reading is an adaptive program that supports students with mastery of literacy skills.
- Moby Max provides adaptive learning in K-8 subjects.

Reading and math take practice. Here are a few ideas to help with that. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- Set up a routine to have your student log in to Lexia every day at home for 20 minutes.
- Read everyday with your child. PAKRAT (Partners and Kids Reading A Lot Together) provides a different book each school day for students to bring home and read for 20 minutes. Your student may also select a book to read from their home reading library.
- Have your student log in to Moby Max and work on their fact fluency.
- Play word games with new vocabulary words and find ways to use these words in family conversations
- Be informed by looking for the school newsletter posted each month on Seesaw.
- Connect to any of the virtual activities on the website.

Students may want to try the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and at school:

- Have your student log in to Lexia! Personalized learning program for students increases their literacy skills.
- Access Seesaw to review your student's learning and see examples of their work.
- Read, read, read! Establish an at-home reading routine to support student practice. All Talahi students will be given an At-Home Reading Library to give them access to books to read at home.
