(KNSI) - Ethan Logeman was virtually attending his AP Psychology class when he got the news. He turned off his camera and left the room to find his mother. Word spread to the rest of his family, his girlfriend and his school counselor.

Logeman had just learned that, on his second attempt, he scored a perfect 36 on the ACT.

Now a senior at Apollo High School, Logeman had taken his first ACT as a junior in February, scoring a 32. It's a score he would have been fine with keeping, he said.

By the next month, COVID-19 had disrupted many of Apollo's then-juniors'

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{ACT}}$ plans; school counselor Richard Larson said the March, April and June $\ensuremath{\mathsf{ACTs}}$ were canceled.

"I believe about the first time a student could take the test was July, in Minnesota," Larson said. "Those test dates filled up big time."


Logeman was able to secure a spot for the September ACT — months after many universities announced they would make ACT and SAT test scores optional for the high school class of 2021 due to the pandemic. Logeman said he wanted to see if he could improve to a 34 or a 35.


