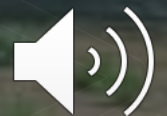

WHY COLLEGE?

A college degree can qualify you for a wider variety of jobs

65% of all MN jobs will require some level of post-secondary training

Over a lifetime, a college graduate is likely to earn approximately \$1 million more than a high school graduate

College graduates typically have better access to health care than those with a high school diploma



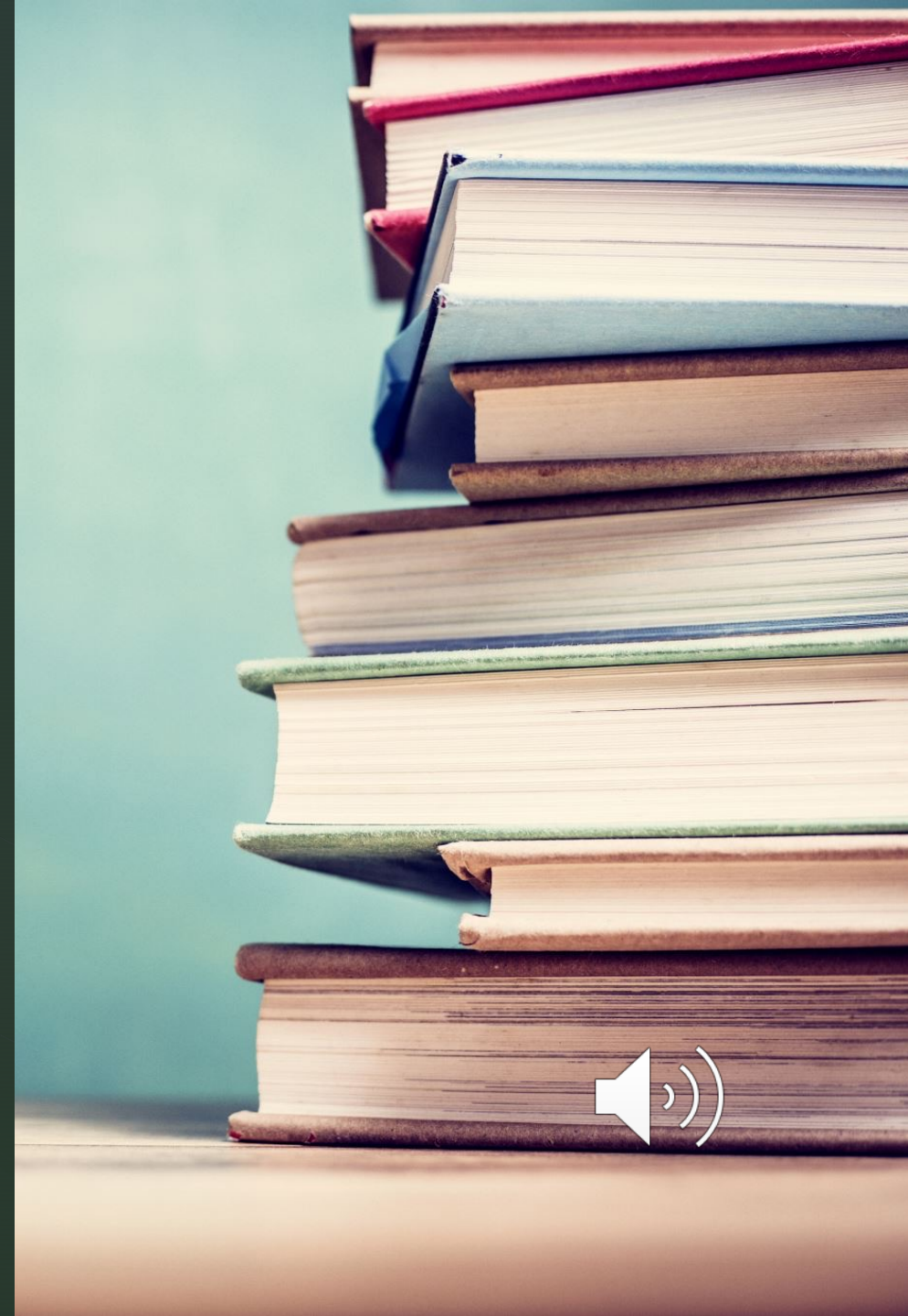
WHY COLLEGE CONTINUES...

Knowledge: A college education teaches you to think critically and abstractly, to express your thoughts and opinions, to weigh options and make informed decisions.

Potential: College brings you a world of information as you explore your interests, and helps you understand the issues that connect communities, the nation and the world.

Opportunity: Critical thinking and new technology skills are vital for success and advancement in today's workforce and provide you with more career and job options.

Income: A person with a college certificate or degree (associate, bachelor's degree or higher) typically has a higher income and is less likely to be unemployed or underemployed than someone with a high school diploma.



TYPES OF COLLEGES



➤ HOW TO MAKE YOUR COLLEGE LIST

Before you apply to college, you need to make a list of colleges that interest you and meet your needs. Here is a guide with suggestions on how to go about doing that.

General: Type of college, location, distance from home, size, etc.

Academic: Type of degree, majors, online v. in-person, etc.

Social: Housing options, student clubs, support services, student body, etc.

Financial: Cost, availability of financial aid and part-time jobs, etc.

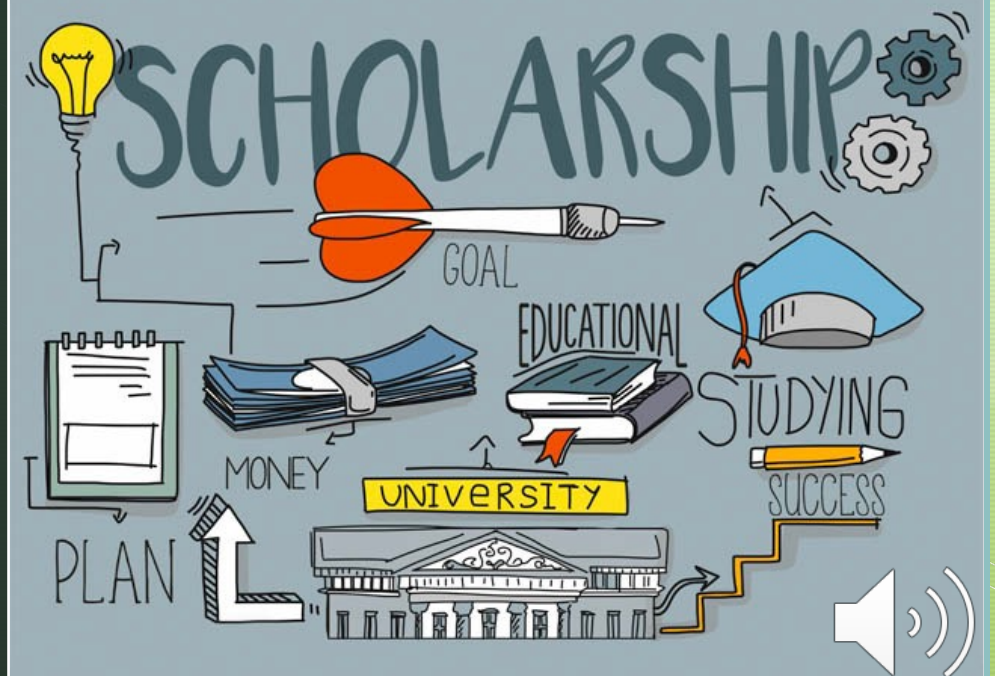
- **FAFSA**
 - Grants, loans, work study

 - Process starts October 1st
- **CSS/Profile**
 - Start applying October 1st (required by many private colleges)
 - Application fee for each school or scholarship required
