Advanced Language Arts: Students who qualify as being academically gifted are eligible for an Advanced Languages Arts program that focuses on enrichment and open-ended learning.

Accelerated Math: Students who demonstrate mastery over their grade level content in mathematics have options to take accelerated course work in courses beyond their assigned grade level.

Differentiated Instruction: Students who demonstrate an additional need in core academics have a variety of options to help them progress to grade level standards.

AVID

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is a college readiness program designed to help students develop the skills they need to be successful in college. The program places special emphasis on growing writing, critical thinking, teamwork, organization and reading skills.

Delivering Instruction Collaboratively

Throughout North Junior High, students will encounter a wide variety of classes with two teachers who are partnering to deliver instruction in a dynamic and differentiated way. The process of co-teaching brings together teachers from different backgrounds, training and licenses to collaborate in planning and lesson delivery.

Technology

Applying 21st Century Learning Tools

North is part of the District 742 Inspire 1:1 initiative, which provides a personal mobile device to each middle level student. North has implemented this approach to learning for three years and is regularly finding new and innovative ways to use technology to better deliver instruction.

Students can elect to take Chinese or Spanish as a Second Language. In addition, North is host to the Chinese Immersion program for middle level students who began in elementary at Madison and will continue on at Apollo.
